## Newsday / News 12 Long Island / Siena College State Senate 7<sup>th</sup> S.D. Poll: Martins Continues Strong Double Digit Lead over Haber Haber Cuts Deficit from 25 to 15 Points; Independents Solidly for Martins

Loudonville, NY. Incumbent Republican State Senator Jack Martins leads Democratic challenger Adam Haber 52-37 percent, down from a 56-31 percent lead three weeks ago, according to a Newsday/News 12 Long Island/Siena College poll of likely voters in the 7<sup>th</sup> Senate District, located in Nassau County.

"Martins' huge 25-point lead is now a still strong 15-point lead, as Haber has brought Democrats home, while

72 percent of Democrats, up from 53 percent three weeks ago. Martins' lead with independent voters increased from 57-30 percent to now 68-19 percent. He also has the support of three-quarters of Catholic voters, who comprise nearly half of the electorate, and one-third of voters supporting Andrew Cuomo for Governor.

"Two-thirds of Martins voters say they are absolutely certain to support him and only about half of Haber voters say that," Greenberg said. "Martins has a nearly three-to-one favorability rating, while Haber's is break even."

"Cuomo continues to lead Rob Astorino, although the lead is down to 18 points, from 29 points. Independents had solidly sided with Cuomo and are now evenly divided," Greenberg said.

"Martins is strongly positioned – in the absence of a dramatic, game changing event – as he seeks to win a third term. Haber has narrowed the gap but there's very little time left to turn this race around," Greenberg said.

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This Newsday/News 12 LI/Siena College State Senate survey was conducted from October 16-21, 2014 by telephone calls to 423 likely voters drawn from a list of registered voters. Determined by a stringent screen, likely voters were statistically adjusted to reflect historic turnout by party registration, gender and age. It has a margin of error of  $\pm$  4.8 percentage points. The Siena College Research Institute, directed by Donald Levy, Ph.D., conducts political, economic, social and cultural research primarily in NYS.
