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Siena New York Poll:

Obama Widens Lead Over McCain to 62-31% Obama Favorability and McCain Unfavorability Highest Ever

3/4 of Voters Agree with Gov: NY Economy Worst Since Great Depression Voters Strongly Support Millionaire's Tax to Close State Budget Deficit

Loudonville, NY. Sen. Barack Obama (D-IL) has widened his lead over Sen. John McCain (R-AZ) to 31 points, up nine points in the last three weeks, according to a new Siena (College) Research Institute poll of likely voters released today. Obama now has the highest favorable rating from likely voters that he has ever had, as McCain has his highest unfavorable rating ever.

"Barack Obama is poised to carry New York big next Tuesday," said Steven Greenberg, spokesman for the

Siena New York Poll. "Obama's momentum among New York likely voters has lifted his lead to 62-31 percent. He has the support of 85 percent of Democrats, 61 percent of independent voters and even 26 percent of Republicans. He is favored by at least 55 percent of voters in every region of the state.

"Two-thirds of voters, including more than one-third of Republicans, view Obama favorably, his highest rating ever. Only 42 percent of voters view McCain favorably, while 53 percent have an unfavorable view. He is, however, doing better than his Vice Presidential nominee, who is viewed unfavorably by 58 percent of voters," Greenberg said

New Yorkers Are Depressed About the State's Economic and Financial Condition

Seventy-eight percent of voters agree – 23 percent strongly – with Gov. David Paterson that the state's economy is the worst it's been since the Great Depression. Only 17 percent disagree. No voters describe the state's fiscal condition as excellent, only 12 percent call it good, 43 percent rate it as fair, and 43 percent call it poor. Voters are virtually evenly divided on whether the state's fiscal condition will be better next year.

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"At least three quarters of voters from every region of the state – and irrespective of party enrollment – agree with the Governor that New York is in the worst fiscal shape it has been in since the Great Depression," Greenberg said. "Seven times as many people rate the state's economy as fair or poor, rather than good or excellent. And nobody rates it as excellent. While 48 percent of voters think it likely the state will be in a better fiscal position next year, 47 percent believe it's unlikely.

"When asked to choose which single action the Governor and Legislature should take to close the state's budget deficit when the Legislature returns next month, 69 percent of voters choose increasing the income tax on millionaires," Greenberg said. "Ten percent prefer increasing taxes and fees other than the income or sales tax, nine percent support cutting health care spending, and only six percent want to see education spending cut. It was pointed out to voters that health care and education are the state's two largest expenditures."

Term Limits For a Moderately Effective Albany

By a margin of 58-37 percent, voters support an eight-year term limit for state officials, including the Governor and Legislature. A majority of Democrats, Republicans, independents and virtually every demographic group supports term limits. A similar majority – 57-41 percent – describe state government in Albany as highly or moderately effective, rather than not very effective or not effective at all in doing its job.

"While a majority of voters describes state government as moderately effective in doing its job, a comparable majority supports term limits for state elected officials," Greenberg said. "Republicans and Democrats may not agree on who to support for President, they do agree on Albany's effectiveness and their desire to see term limits implemented in Albany. Independent voters also agree with their more partisan neighbors."

Paterson's Grades Continue to Rise with Voters

Paterson has a 62-19 percent favorable rating, the first time it has exceeded 60 percent. His job performance rating is 55 percent positive, 40 percent negative, the best it's ever been. If the election for Governor were tomorrow, 40 percent of voters (also a high) said they would vote for Paterson, with 29 percent preferring "someone else." In matchups against Mayor Mike Bloomberg and former Mayor Rudy Giuliani, Paterson scores his best numbers to date, losing to Bloomberg 47-43 percent and beating Giuliani 51-40 percent.

"Governor Paterson's rating with voters has made a slow but steady climb over the seven months he has been Governor and more voters have become familiar with him," Greenberg said. "While bad economic news and tough fiscal talk by chief executives do not always play well with voters, the more he talks about the economy and the budget, the more voters seem to be embracing what the Governor is saying."
