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Siena New York Poll:

Paterson Is Weakest He's Ever Been by Every Measure

Voters Rate Direction & Fiscal Condition of New York as Worst Ever Confidence in State Leaders to Resolve Budget Crisis Erodes

Loudonville, NY. Governor David Paterson's standing with New York voters has taken a major hit as his favorable rating, his job performance rating and his position in 2010 primary and general election head-to-head matchups have all fallen to their lowest levels since Paterson became Governor nearly one year ago, according to a new Siena (College) Research Institute poll of registered voters. Also falling to record lows in the new Siena New York Poll are voters' views on the direction the state is headed in, the state's fiscal condition and the confidence voters have in state leaders to successfully address the budget crisis.

Paterson is now viewed favorably by 40 percent of voters and unfavorably by 47 percent, down from last month's 54-30 percent favorable rating, and his high of 64-19 percent in November. His job performance rating is 28 percent positive, 69 percent negative down from 51-45 percent positive last month. Currently, only 19 percent of voters are prepared to elect Paterson as Governor in 2010, compared to 57 percent who prefer "someone else." That's down from 32-36 percent last month, and 42-32 percent in November.

"David Paterson has reached a low water mark with voters since becoming Governor," said Steven Greenberg, spokesman for the Siena New York Poll. "Between the Senate appointment process, which is still the focus of negative reports one month later, and the attacks being waged across the media by those opposed to his budget proposals, the Governor is tumbling in the polls from record highs three months ago to new record lows."

In a hypothetical 2010 Democratic primary for Governor, Paterson trails Attorney General Andrew Cuomo 53-27 percent. Last month Paterson led 35-33 percent, and in November he led 53-25 percent. In potential general election matchups, Paterson trails former Mayor Rudy Giuliani 51-36 percent, after leading Giuliani 44-42 percent last month and 51-38 percent in December. Cuomo leads Giuliani 51-38 percent. Paterson leads former Congressman Rick Lazio 46-28 percent, and Cuomo beats Lazio 66-16 percent.

"The good news for the Governor is that the election is more than a year and a half away. The bad news is there is a lot of catching up to do and it's hard work trying to restore voters' faith," Greenberg said.

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Only 31 percent of voters feel the state is headed on the right track, compared to 53 percent – the highest ever in a Siena poll – who think the state is headed in the wrong direction. Last month it was 39-42 percent. Nearly two-thirds of voters, 65 percent, also the highest ever, rate the state's fiscal condition as poor, with another 28 percent calling it fair.

"More New Yorkers than at any time in the last four years are unhappy with the direction in which their state is headed," Greenberg said. "And virtually every voter in the state – well, 93 percent of them – view the fiscal condition of New York as poor or fair.

"In addition, New Yorkers' faith in the Governor and Legislature to successfully resolve the budget crisis has dropped dramatically in just the last month," Greenberg said. "Now, far more voters have little or no confidence in state leaders' ability to solve the budget crisis."

Currently, 37 percent of voters are very or somewhat confident that the budget crisis will be solved, compared to 61 percent of voters who are not very or not at all confident. Last month is was 52-45 percent confident.

"Voters continue to overwhelmingly support increasing the personal income tax on millionaires – 77-19 percent – to close the budget gap, and 59 percent support an income tax increase on those making more than \$250,000 a year," Greenberg said.

"The commercials against the Governor's

budget proposals are having an impact. More than 80 percent of voters are concerned that the proposed budget cuts in health and education would adversely affect the quality of health care and education in New York," Greenberg said.

When presented with a choice, 51 percent of voters said the budget should be balanced primarily by using the Federal stimulus money and increasing the income tax on those earning \$250,000, while 38 percent prefer using the Federal stimulus money and budget cuts to balance the budget.

"Voters recognize the fiscal crisis New York and New Yorkers face. They understand that balancing the state budget is complicated. But their message to state leaders is consistent and clear: do not solve the budget crisis by endangering the quality of health care or education," Greenberg said.

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This SRI survey was conducted February 16-18, 2009 by telephone calls to 622 New York State registered voters.
