Incumbent Republican Congressman John Culberson holds an early three-point lead over his Democratic challenger, lawyer Lizzie Pannill Fletcher, 48-45 percent, according to a new New York Times Upshot/Siena College poll of likely Texas 7th Congressional District voters. Pannill Fletcher has a 28-23 percent favorability rating, compared to a 43-33 percent favorability rating for Culberson.

Likely voters in this Houston-area district are evenly divided between preferring Democrats or Republicans to control the House of Representatives next year, 48-48 percent. Voters give President Trump an eight-point negative job approval rating with 43 percent approving the job he is doing and 51 percent disapproving and by 55-39 percent they oppose an immigration reform bill that would reduce legal immigration and provide funds for a wall along the U.S.-Mexican border.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College Poll is part of an ongoing project polling pivotal Congressional races across the country. This New York Times Upshot/Siena College TX 07 survey was conducted September 14-18, 2018 by telephone calls in English and Spanish to 500 TX 07 voters. This poll has a margin of error of ± 5.0 percentage points. Calls were made to a stratified weighted sample of voters from the L-2 Voter list via both land and cell phones. A likely-to-vote probability was computed for each respondent based on their stated likelihood to vote as well as by virtue of the imputation of a turnout probability score based on past voting behavior. This combined probability to vote score was applied as a weight along with a weight that considered party, age, race/ethnicity, education, region within the district and gender.
