The New York Times Upshot / Siena College Arizona 02 Poll: Democrat Kirkpatrick 50% Republican Marquez Peterson 39%

Voters Prefer Democrats Control House 51-43%; Give President Trump Large Negative 42-54% Job Approval Rating

Favorability Ratings: Marquez Peterson, 27-24 Percent; Kirkpatrick, 40-38 Percent

Loudonville, NY. Democratic former Member of Congress, Ann Kirkpatrick holds an 11-point lead over Republican businesswoman, Lea Marquez Peterson, 50-39 percent, according to a new New York Times Upshot/Siena College poll of likely Arizona 2nd Congressional District voters. Marquez Peterson has a 27-24 percent favorability rating, compared to a 40-38 percent favorability rating for Kirkpatrick.

Likely voters in this southern Arizona district prefer Democrats rather than Republicans control the House of Representatives next year, 51-43 percent. Voters give President Trump a large 12-point negative job approval rating with 42 percent approving the job he is doing and 54 percent disapproving and by 54-40 percent they prefer their representative serve as a check on President Trump rather than support him and his agenda.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College Poll is part of an ongoing project polling pivotal Congressional races across the country. The data is published live on <https://www.nytimes.com/section/upshot>. This press release highlights the key findings and provides access in the [cross-tabulations](#) to the entire survey as well as how demographic groups answered each question.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College AZ 02 survey was conducted September 26-October 1, 2018 by telephone calls in English and Spanish to 502 AZ 02 voters. This poll has a margin of error of ± 4.5 percentage points. Calls were made to a stratified weighted sample of voters from the L-2 Voter list via both land and cell phones. A likely-to-vote probability was computed for each respondent based on their stated likelihood to vote as well as by virtue of the imputation of a turnout probability score based on past voting behavior. This combined probability to vote score was applied as a weight along with a weight that considered party, age, race/ethnicity, education, region within the district and gender.
