The New York Times Upshot / Siena College New Jersey 3 Poll: Democrat Kim 49% Republican Incumbent MacArthur 39%

Voters Prefer Democrats Control House 52-40%; Give President Trump Negative 42-53% Job Approval Rating

Favorability Ratings: MacArthur, 28-41 Percent; Kim, 36-28 Percent

Loudonville, NY. Democratic former White House Official Andy Kim holds a 10-point lead over incumbent Republican Congressman Tom MacArthur, 49-39 percent, according to a new New York Times Upshot/Siena College poll of likely New Jersey 3rd Congressional District voters. MacArthur has a negative 28-41 percent favorability rating, compared to a 36-28 percent favorability rating for Kim.

Likely voters in this central New Jersey district prefer Democrats rather than Republicans control the House of Representatives next year, 52-40 percent. Voters give President Trump a large 11-point negative job approval rating with 42 percent approving the job he is doing and 53 percent disapproving and by 49-40 percent they oppose Brett Kavanaugh's nomination to the United States Supreme Court.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College Poll is part of an ongoing project polling pivotal Congressional races across the country. The data is published live on https://www.nytimes.com/section/upshot. This press release highlights the key findings and provides access in the cross-tabulations to the entire survey as well as how demographic groups answered each question.

This New York Times Upshot/Siena College NJ 03 survey was conducted September 22-26, 2018 by telephone calls in English to 499 NJ 03 voters. This poll has a margin of error of ± 4.8 percentage points. Calls were made to a stratified weighted sample of voters from the L-2 Voter list via both land and cell phones. A likely-to-vote probability was computed for each respondent based on their stated likelihood to vote as well as by virtue of the imputation of a turnout probability score based on past voting behavior. This combined probability to vote score was applied as a weight along with a weight that considered party, age, race/ethnicity, education, region within the district and gender.
