This Siena College Poll was conducted November 12 - 16, 2023, among 505 Long Island Registered Voters. Of the 505 respondents, 433 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode and 72 respondents were drawn from a proprietary online panel (Lucid). Telephone calls were conducted in English and respondent sampling was initiated by asking for the youngest person in the household. Telephone sampling was conducted via a stratified dual frame probability sample of landline and cell phone telephone numbers weighted to reflect known population patterns. The landline telephone sample was obtained from ASDE and the cell phone sample was obtained from Dynata. Data from collection modes was statistically adjusted by age, party, race/ethnicity, education, and gender to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 6.1 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
