This special environmental survey was conducted March 25 - 31, 2024, among 915 New York State residents as part of a Community-Based Research course at Siena College with support from the Siena College Research Institute. Of the 915 respondents, 0 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode and 915 respondents were drawn from a proprietary online panel (Lucid). Data from collection modes was statistically adjusted by age, party registration, region, race/ethnicity, and gender to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 3.6 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
