Telephone sampling was conducted via a weighted stratified dual frame sample of landline and cell phone drawn from the L-2 database of registered voters. Data was statistically adjusted by region, race/ethnicity, political party, education, statewide vote pattern in the 2020 election, a combined measure of stated and derived vote likelihood and gender to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 6.1 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
