This NY01 Newsday Poll was conducted October 13 - October 17, 2024, among 526 CD01 Likely Voters. Telephone sampling was conducted via a weighted stratified dual frame sample of landline and cell phone drawn from the L-2 database of registered voters (526 completed via telephone). Data was statistically adjusted by political party, age, education, gender, and voter likelihood, a computed score that combines voter history, stated voter likelihood and modeled turnout by respondent. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.5 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
